### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Principal activities and objects of the charity

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was the provision of support services to vulnerable Merseyside residents to reduce social isolation and improve levels of independence. The organisation provides a range of charitable activities and services to meet these objectives.

#### Services provided:

- Adult Care
- Children's Care
- End of Life Support
- Bereavement Support Services
- Professional Counselling
- Dementia Support

The central activity is the provision of home care services to older people with the central ethos of 'Connecting People to the highest quality of care'.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

The year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018 was a very positive year for the charity and the most productive in nearly a decade. The charity has undergone much change in the past year all focussed on improving the effectiveness and quality of its operations and services. Key changes have included:

- Central organisational restructure
- Introduction of CEO Paul Growney
- Rebranding from Care and Respite Support Services to Caring Connections
- Introduction of a new charitable services strategy
- Introduction of 4 new charitable services
- Changing of organisational technology
- Improvement of employment offer to care support workers

#### Key Performance Objectives:

**80** – The number of clients we provide personalised care and tailored support for within their own homes and communities. This year we provided over **60000** hours of personalised care.

**170** – The number of people with dementia attending our regular 'Pauline's Parties' which promote social inclusion and general fun.

**68** – The number of people attending our local community support groups, which provide counselling and promote psychological wellbeing.

**10** – The number of people accessing our bereavement counselling and talking therapy with 5 people now feeling that they have been able to integrate back into society.

#### **Social Impact**

The organisation is dedicated to improving its social impact on the local community / social economy. First Ark Social Impact consultants were commissioned to complete a social impact report for Caring Connections for the financial year 17/18.

- **64** people employed by Caring Connections with 43% retaining for 2 or more years.
- 42 employees achieved a vocational qualification at Level 2 or higher
- £382,356 of cost savings through reduction in welfare benefits
- £526,244 of additional spend within the local economy
- £569,250 of social value through employment and education
- **58** local people supported with depression and anxiety
- 234 people engaged with provision and activities to reduce social isolation
- £276,480 of cost savings through reduction in NHS usage
- **£1,408,200** of social value through reduced social isolation, improvements in depression and anxiety and increased confidence and levels of wellbeing.

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

The end of year produced a deficit of £34,574 against a deficit of £13,343 in the year ended 31st March 2017. This deficit was as a result of cuts to the hourly rate achieved as well as a decrease in the number of support hours we delivered.

Plans are in place to increase the number of support hours we deliver in order to drive us closer to long term sustainability. In order to deliver this growth we will need to invest in recruitment, training and retention.

Our total income for the year was £807,381 against a total income for the previous year of £817,269 and for 2016 of £817,801.

The reserves of the Charity decreased by £34,574 and totalled £6,813.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Governing document and Charitable status**

Caring Connections Limited was registered as a charity by the Charity Commissioners for all purposes in June 1992 (certificate number 1013152).

Caring Connections Limited is a Company Limited by Guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 1985. The Charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association which define its aims, objectives, duties and responsibilities.

#### Constitution

The company has no share capital, being a company limited by guarantee. Under clause 5.2 of its Articles of Association the liability of each member is limited to £5 in the event of the company being wound up. The number of members registered at 31 March 2018 was 4.

#### **Trustees**

The trustees during the year under review were:

The trustees are elected every year at the company's Annual General Meeting.

#### **Organisational structure**

The Board of Trustees administers the Charity. The Board meets bi-monthly and more frequently if required. The Charity is subject to inspections by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

The Charity is also required to provide monitoring information to its funders in relation to charitable funders in which we have had to provide project monitoring / grant end reports.

CQC concern themselves with ensuring that the quality of care provided by our charity meets government standards of quality and safety. As an organisation we strive to reach excellent standards in CQC audits.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### **Appointment of Trustees**

As set out in the Articles of Association, Trustees are appointed by members at the Annual General Meeting of the Charity. Trustees may at their discretion admit individuals or organisations to membership, providing they have paid any annual subscription if appropriate. The Board of Trustees may appoint a person who is willing to act to be a Trustee, either to fill a casual vacancy or as an additional Trustee.

#### **Trustee Induction and Training**

New Trustees spend time with the Management team having the aims and objectives and the policies and procedures of the Charity explained to them. Every trustee receives a comprehensive induction pack which includes a copy of the latest CQC report, a copy of the Articles of Association and the latest Annual Report.

Trustees are also encouraged to attend appropriate internally organised meetings in addition to attending external training events and networking events.

#### **Public Benefit**

The Charity exists to provide services to members of the public with care needs and also for carers. This support enables people to live fulfilling lives as part of their local community. Without this support their own health and wellbeing may suffer as may the carers' health and wellbeing. It is part of our ethos to develop services to meet the changing needs of people with care needs and their carers and to be responsive to requests for support. Any surplus generated from the provision of our services is reinvested in improving the service we deliver.

#### **Risk management**

The trustees have a risk management strategy in place that includes:

- An annual review of the risks that the Charity may face;
- The establishment of systems and procedures designed to reduce or eliminate those risks identified in the strategy;
- The implementation of procedures designed to minimise any potential impact on the Charity should those risks materialise.

The risk management exercise focuses on all areas of risk including non-financial. The exercise also addresses issues around the recruitment and retention of staff, together with the appropriate remuneration scales to enable the Charity to continue to be the first choice of local people wanting to work in the care sector.

The charity has access to comprehensive legal, personnel and service delivery advice. They also have a comprehensive insurance package in place.

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Investment policy

The Trustees whilst retaining their cautious approach to investments have authorised that any surplus funds can be deposited in a suitable interest bearing bank or building society account. This approach will be revisited at least annually to ensure that maximum returns are being achieved whilst trying to protect the assets of the Charity.

#### **Reserves policy**

The Trustees have established a policy that the Charity should aim to retain unrestricted reserves (that are those funds that are freely available) that will cover between three to six months of annual expenditure. The freely available reserves as at 31 March 2018 was £4,404 (2017 - £37,889) against total unrestricted expenditure of £841,955 (2017 -£830,612). The impact of the cuts in social care funding, both at a national and local, as well as increased competition in the market has resulted in the Trustees policy on reserves not having been achieved. The trustees are looking at various options to rectify this position.

Reserves are held to cover any delay in receiving funding income whilst allowing the normal business operation of the Charity to continue. In addition, the Charity retains reserves to cover possible redundancy payments should the charity have to reduce the size of its operation.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The trustees believe the charity will continue to trade for the next 12 months and therefore the accounts are prepared on a going concern basis.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 20% on reducing balance

Computer equipment - 25% on cost

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### **Pensions**

The company pays fixed contributions to the personal pension schemes of some employees.
